The panel consists of individuals who have been trained in the HCBS Final Rule. The intended audience is individuals who are receiving services, guardians, and advocates; staff are also welcomed to attend. The presentation will focus upon the HCBS Final Rule and how it relates to choice and control for the individual. The training is at no cost for those who attend. Members and staff liaisons are asked to share the training and to begin spreading the opportunity to those who might be interested. She spoke about the Behavior Treatment Data for FY21Q2, the Critical Incidents Reporting System up to FY21Q2, and the FY21Q1 Michigan Mission Based Performance Indicator System (MMBPIS). Members provided feedback on the information shared. ✓ Dan Dedloff (MSHN) provided an update on the Consumer Representation Process. The proposal has been reviewed and approved by the MSHN Operations Council. The proposal and the application for consideration was reviewed. Members and staff liaisons were asked to share the opportunity with those who might be interested. Dan Dedloff is available to answer any additional questions. ✓ Dan Dedloff (MSHN) provided an overview on the proposed Public Behavioral Health System Redesign Initiatives. The intent of the bills are to eliminate the PIHP system and creates a single statewide administrative services organization (ASO) to replace the PIHPs. An oversight council would also be formed to assist MDHHS in overseeing the single ASO
