MSHN PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT	<p>Seeking committee feedback about barriers and potential intervention for the upcoming PIP related to racial disparities in CMHSP service penetration rates. Reviewed baseline data for the PIP and possible identified barriers. The PIP is on service penetration rates for historically marginalized groups. Barriers discussed: lack of awareness of services, stigma, and different perceptions of stigma in obtaining physical care and mental health care. Individuals may also feel that there may be few persons like them from whom they can receive services. There is also systemic mistrust of care systems, not just the personal experience. Saginaw is awaiting the results of their racial disparities study. They have found very similar barriers thus far. Geographically, how far are providers from persons they would be serving?</p>

NUMBERED LETTER L-22-26: WRAPAROUND SERVICES	<p>Requirements for evaluation and outcomes measurement for wraparound services. Expectation that all children/youth in CCI placements have a wraparound facilitator and CMHSP capacity with trained facilitators and supervisors. Shifting responsibility for placement to CMHSPs as opposed to foster care and juvenile justice. Need for WRAP trainings by MDHHS. Increased instances of county DHHS offices seeking foster care exceptions to have CMHSPs place adolescents in adult AFCs. Joelin is on a state level workgroup that is looking to address children's issues among the agencies. Looking at doing a survey. DHHS has reduced number of children's residential beds which is NOT indicative of need going down.</p>

CMHSP WSA user training will occur 9/8/2022. The 9/8/2022 training will cover detailed process for enrollment and approval of 1915(i) services. All individuals who are eligible for 1915(i) services will be phased in to the WSA between Septemer 2022 – September 30, 2023.
